Because of the rising elderly population in America, providing housing for the elderly has become a prevalent issue in society. One of the most relevant issues is that of elderly abuse, which takes on physical, emotional, and verbal forms. Another relevant component of the elderly housing issue is that housing in cities such as Berkeley can be expensive. Luckily there are haven organizations like Satellite Affordable Housing Associates, that work towards providing affordable housing for seniors in the community. However, the available spaces are limited so that not many people receive this housing opportunity. This is a problem in the works, which requires more city funding. Beyond this external problem, an internal problem to tackle is that those that do receive the housing opportunity get very lonely. This is where us volunteers come in! Whether volunteers host games like Bingo (a Berkeley SAHA Amistad House favorite) or share stories with elders, we've seen seniors in these homes thrive from volunteering activity. Bears for Elder Welfare encourages you to go into the community and volunteer for an elderly home, as it can be a very fun and rewarding experience!

Club Updates -

This month's education presentation topic was elderly housing. Elderly housing consists of independent living (living without any assistance), assisted living (living with some help with meals, medication management, etc.), and nursing homes (living with licensed, professional care). The main housing issue that elderly people face is a high cost of living; many turn to subsidized housing to try to make ends meet. Another issue is the presence of elder abuse in these housing units. Abuse can be emotional, verbal, or physical. This is a very grave, very real, yet commonly overlooked issue. We not only want to bring this issue to light, but also resolve to promote the dignity of elders in our community through volunteering in senior centers to facilitate a change in attitude towards this population.
